Celebrating 145 Years for the Next 145 Years

On Sunday April 14th we celebrated Bethany's 145th anniversary with a birthday party! We had cake and balloons and confetti! We looked at photos, bulletins, newsletters, and more from our past. It was truly a celebration. We even ran out of cake!

While streamers and birthday cakes may feel silly and unimportant, celebrating 145 years of ministry gives us an opportunity to dream about



the next 145 years of ministry. That's the thing about celebrating milestones. It's just as much about looking back as it is about looking forward. For 145 years Bethany has reinvented its mission to meet the needs of their community and their world.



In 1879, thirty-five immigrants worked hard to establish a Lutheran church for all those coming from Sweden who would need a spiritual home and community in this new-to-them world.

In 1905 Bethany built a chapel in the northern part of Escanaba so that all those, even those who couldn't travel too far to the main sanctuary could participate in the life of the church and its community.

In 1921 English services began. The community had grown, the children of Swedish immigrants were adjusting to life here, and new people needed to know the Gospel was for them.

In 1977 the Ark Preschool was established to meet early education needs in our community.

In 2022 The Bethany Lutheran Free Store began so that Bethany could continue its tradition of meeting the needs of the community. Offering household supplies and personal hygiene products, The Free Store offers a helping hand so that household budgets can work for families in Escanaba.

This is only a snapshot of 145 years of ministry. This is only a glimpse at the way God has used the members and the gifts of Bethany for the sake of the Gospel in the world.

I hope when you think about this birthday celebration you are able to see the resilience and hope 145 years gifts us today. God is faithful. We don't know what that looks like, nor do we know where that will lead us. But we trust that God's good news in Jesus Christ is at work in our world and through our community.



Jesus was the hope of those 35 Swedish immigrants in 1879, and Jesus remains that hope for us today. A prayer for us as we think about the next 145 years:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen


