# PASTORAL PONDERINGS WITH PASTOR LILY



New Year and Epiphany Blessings to you and your home!

The Christmas season lasts for a short twelve days. If we are being honest, by the time December 25th passes, most of us are a little tired and a little partied out. I hope the twelve days of Christmas for you, are restful, rejuvenating, and filled with the joy of small moments.

On January 6th, we shift from the season of Christmas to the season of Epiphany. For you etymology nerds, epiphany comes from a Greek work meaning 'manifestation'. The Christmas season ends by the church's celebration of the manifestation of God's love in Jesus Christ. Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as God's love letter to the world. We celebrate that this love is real and that it's tangible in our own lives.

How are you participating in this revelation? How are you manifesting God's love letter to you during this season? These kinds of questions shape our lives as disciples of Jesus. Our spiritual practices help in our formation.

Give these practices a try this Epiphany season!

1) Try filling in the blank every morning when you wake up or right before you god to bed: "Because Jesus is [fill in the blank], I am [fill in the blank]."

"Because Jesus can [fill in the blank], I can [fill in the blank]."

2) Bless your home using the Epiphany blessing found in the January Echo!

Incorporating new spiritual practices and continuing old ones is a great way to celebrate the season of Epiphany and the beginning of the new year. These practices remind us of the tangible ways God shows us love through Jesus in our world. Our lives focus on the revelation of Jesus alive among us, bringing hope to our weary world.

#### An Epiphany Blessing for Your House

January 6<sup>th</sup> is Epiphany. In Eastern Europe a tradition of blessing your home began and has spread around the world. The Magi used the light of the star to find Jesus. Like this star we hope our own homes and lives reflect the hope of Jesus to all the world. All you need is a piece of chalk, your household, and the words in bold. Say these words gathered around the entrace to your home.



Peace be to this house and to all who enter here.

A reading from Proverbs: "By wisdom a house is built, and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures."

Let us pray. Gracious God, as a shining star once guided the magi to the birthplace of the infant Jesus, so enable those who dwell here to be your light in the world; through Jesus Christ we pray.

Everyone says amen.

Using chalk inscribe the frame above your front door with the inscription shown below. The letters C M B stand for Christus Mansionem Benedicat (it's okay if you can't pronounce this!) which means "May Christ bless this dwelling!" 2024 marks our current year!

Give each person a chance to make one of these marks!

$$20 + C + M + B + 24$$

A reading from Isaiah: "The effect of righteousness is peace, and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever. My people will abide in a peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and quiet places."

Let us pray. God, we pray that you will bless this home and all who live here with your gracious presence, that your love may be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light, and your peace our benediction; through Jesus Christ we pray.

## 2024 LENTEN SOUP & SANDWICHES


Mark your calendars!
